

Piedmont Technical College /Lander University Early Childhood Articulation

2020-2021

In order to receive transfer credit, students must do the following:

1. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher to be admitted to Teacher Education at Lander University.
2. Complete the ECD, EDU and general education courses at PTC, listed in the articulation agreement, with a grade of C or better in each course.
3. Pass all three portions of the PRAXIS Core (reading, writing, and math) or obtain a total score of 22 on the ACT, 1100 on the two-part SAT, or 1650 on the three-part SAT.
4. Successfully defend the ECD 244 portfolio during the final semester at PTC.
5. Meet with a Lander University advisor during the final semester at PTC to initiate the transfer and ensure financial aid application deadlines are met.
6. Meet with a Lander University advisor during the final semester at PTC to declare a program emphasis (STEAM, Montessori, or ESOL). Bring evidence of successfully completed TB test, SLED check, and a copy of the student Social Security card to this meeting.

Credit is not granted by transfer for vocational, remedial, or developmental courses.

Lander University reserves the right to determine whether any particular course meets the requirements and standards of the college for transfer. Although a course may transfer, it may not apply directly to a particular major or program.

Students entering into the Lander University Early Childhood Education program will be subject to the requirements specified in the catalog that is current at the time of their matriculation into the program.

The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the standards set forth by the Southern Association of College and Schools (SACS), InTASC, CAEP standards, and Lander University's Early Childhood Education program changes.

The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education and Early Childhood Education requirements at Lander University and the equivalent at Piedmont Technical College.
