Total number of transfer hours cannot exceed 72, so students will need to be selective on which courses outside of the ECD block in which they enroll. Students must complete the primary ECD block first, but all others can be completed at either institution.

In order to receive transfer credit, students must do the following:

1. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
2. Complete 45 semester hours of coursework transferable into the ECE degree program at Newberry College, as a combination of 24 from the ECD grid, and 21 from the General Education section. This is the equivalent of 57 PTC hours.
3. Complete the ECD and EDU courses at PTC, listed in the articulation agreement, with a grade of C or better in each course.
4. Pass all three portions of the PRAXIS I (reading, writing and math) or obtain a total score of 24 on the ACT, 1100 on the two part SAT, or 1650 on the three part SAT.
5. Complete the Teacher Education admissions essay.
6. Complete the Teacher Education admissions application in Live Text.
7. Meet with a Newberry College advisor during final semester at PTC to initiate transfer, and ensure financial aid application deadlines are adhered to.
8. Complete additional general education courses (see below) with a “C” or better, either before or after transferring to Newberry College. These courses may be completed at either Newberry College or Piedmont Technical College. All transfer credit evaluations are done on a course-by-course basis, from official transcripts.

Students entering into the Early Childhood Education program at Newberry College will be subject to the requirements specified in the catalog that is current at the time of their matriculation into the program.

Course work is evaluated by the Registrar's Office and Chair of the Department of Education. Upon admission, applicants' transcripts are reviewed by the Registrar and forwarded to the appropriate office for academic advising. Each institution and its authorized representatives agree to provide students who wish to transfer with relevant, current, and sound academic advice so that neither legitimate credit hours nor time will be lost in a student's attempt to secure the Associate and/or Baccalaureate degree.

The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the standards set forth by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) NAEYC standards, NCATE standards and Newberry College's Early Childhood Education program changes. The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education and Early Childhood Education requirements at Newberry College and the equivalent at Piedmont Technical College.

#### Transfer Credit Restrictions:

1. Credit is not granted by transfer for vocational, remedial, or developmental courses.
2. Transfer students may transfer up to a maximum of 72 semester hours from junior, technical, or community colleges. For students transferring from a 2-year school, a minimum of 54 semester hours must be completed at Newberry College; and, students must complete the last 30 hours at Newberry College.
3. All courses which can be applied to the Newberry College degree will require a grade of "C" or higher in the course work being transferred.
4. Newberry College reserves the right to determine whether any particular course meets the requirements and standards of the College for transfer. Although a course may transfer, it may not apply directly to a particular major or program.
