Articulation Agreement Piedmont Technical College and Lander University Early Childhood Education

This articulation agreement establishes an arrangement between Lander University and Piedmont Technical College (PTC) whereby students who take the named courses in Chart 1 at PTC are guaranteed transferability of those credits to Lander University in fulfillment of specific degree requirements for the bachelor's degree in early childhood education.

Chart 2 gives a preview of how to complete the degree in 4 semesters at Lander University.

This articulation agreement is to be used in advising PTC students who wish to transfer to Lander University, ensuring a streamlined planning process for students.

In order to receive transfer credit, students must do the following:

- 1. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher to be admitted to Teacher Education at Lander University.
- 2. Complete the ECD and EDU and general education courses at PTC, listed in the articulation agreement, with a grade of C or better in each course.
- 3. Submit a passing score on all three portions of the PRAXIS Core (reading, writing and math). Students scoring 22 on the ACT, 1100 on the redesigned SAT (Evidence-based Reading and Writing and Math), or 1650 on the three part SAT (Math, Reading and Writing may exempt all three subtests of Praxis Core.
 - a. Students with a score of 550 on the Evidence-based Reading and Writing portion of the SAT may exempt the Reading and Writing subtests of Praxis Core.
 - b. Students with a score of 550 on the Math portion of the redesigned SAT may exempt the Math subtest of Praxis Core.
 - c. Students who earned a score of at least 22 on the ACT English Test may exempt the Reading and Writing subtests of Praxis Core.
 - d. Students who earned a score of at least 22 on the ACT Math Test may exempt the Mathematics subtest of Praxis Core.
- 4. Successfully defend ECD 244 portfolio during final semester at PTC.
- 5. Meet with a Lander University advisor during final semester at PTC to do the following:
 - a. Initiate transfer and ensure financial aid application deadlines are adhered to.
 - b. Declare a program emphasis (STEAM, Montessori, or ESOL).
 - c. Provide evidence of TB test, SLED check, and a copy of Social Security card.
- 6. Lander University reserves the right to determine whether any particular course meets the requirements and standards for transferability. Although a course may transfer, it may not apply directly to a particular major or program.
- 7. Students will be subject to the requirements specified in the current catalog (i.e. the Lander University catalog in effect on the first day of full time coursework at Lander University).
- 8. The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the standards set forth by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), NAEYC standards, NCATE/CAEP standards, and Lander University's Early Childhood Education program changes. The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education and Early Childhood Education requirements at Lander University and the equivalent at Piedmont Technical College.
