## National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) Accredited Early Care and Education Associate Degree Programs in the South Carolina Technical College System

This agreement is a culmination of many collaborative summits, meetings, and initialives to improve the quality of child care and early education programs in South Carolina by cultivating a well-trained and educated workforce. Collaborative partners from the Early Childhood Education community include two-year and fouryear higher education institutions, Head Start, the child care community, the Center for Child Care Career Development, the SC Department of Social Services, the SC Technical College System, and other child care and early education advocates. The purpose of this agreement is to provide an opportunity for graduates who have received their Associate Degree in Early Care and Education from NAEYC aceredied two-year colleges to transfer to Columbia College to pursue their Bachelor Degree in Early Childhood Education.

In order to receive trans fer credit, students must do the following:

1. Complete the approved Early Care and Education Associate Degree that includes specific courses identified by this agreement.
2. Earn no less than a grade of $C$ in any course.
3. Meet with a Columbia College advisor before enrolling in coursework at Columbia College. (Recommended as soon as possible following Associate Degree completion.)
4. Complete additional general education courses (see below) either before or after transferring to Columbia College. These courses may be completed at either Columbia College or the regional technical college.

Students entering into the Farly Childhood Education program at Columbia College will be subject to the requirements specified in the catalog that is current at the time of their matriculation into the program. Before transferring to Columbia College, students must take either Praxis I or obtain a total score of 1650 on the SAT. Students will also be given an English, math, and language proficiency exam from Columbia College.

Individual analysis of student transcripts will be made for credits accumulated under the semester system from the two-year colleges. Each institution and its authorized representatives agree to provide students who wish to transfer with relevant, current, and sound academic advice so that neither legitimate credit hours nor time will be lost in a student's attempt to secure the Associate and/or Baccalaureate degree.

The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the Commission on Higher Education guidelines, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) standards, NAEYC standards, and Columbia College's Early Childhood Education program changes. The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education and Early Childhood Education requirements at Columbia College and the equivalent at the two-year college.

The maximum credit acceptable from a junior college is 72 semester hours, including a maximum of four semester hours in physical education activity courses. Degree applicants must complete a minimum of 25 percent of all courses required by the degree at Columbia College. This requirement means that at least 33 semester hours of course work must be taken at Columbia College for all programs except the B.S. in Biology with certification, the B.S. in Chemistry with certification, and the B.A. in Dance Education, which require 39, 34, and 35, respectively. A student must take at least 12
soncster hours in her major at Columbia College. These 12 hours cannot include courses graded on a pass/fail basis. A student must take at least one-half of the hours in her minor at Columbia College.

127 hours are required for graduation. Teacher candidates must pass all three parts of the Praxis I (Reading, Writing, Mathematics) to begin the sequence of Education courses. Teacher candidates must pass all required Praxis II exams to complete Directed Teaching and graduate. All other requirements for Target assessments for Education majors must be met at the appropriate times. Work schedule flexibility must allow for the field experience requirements contained in methods and field courses taken over four semesters to be completed during the day in schools. 150 bours in schools are required for the Directed Teaching semester. The final semester is fultime.
