By completing this affidavit, you affirm that this student will live with you free of any charge for room and food for every year he or she is studying at Piedmont Technical College and living in the U.S. (The student cannot be required to provide you with any employment services in exchange for the room and board.) Before signing the affidavit, you must understand that the financial commitment you are making to the student should not be broken and failure to provide can result in the student having to return home.

Do not expect that the student will be able to help support the costs through employment. Employment is strictly controlled by the immigration service and is very limited.

This form must be completed in English and signed in the presence of a Notary Public.

Prove that you are capable of providing this support for every year of the student's program by attaching a copy of the **Lease**, **Deed or rent receipts and proof of income** in the sponsor's name.

These documents must be less than six months old.
