AT&T PROVIDES SUPPORT FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

AT&T recently made a generous \$5,000 donation to the Piedmont Technical College Foundation to help support the dual enrollment program at Strom Thurmond High School.

The contribution will provide 10 \$500 scholarships

to students at Strom Thurmond who wish to enroll in the dual enrollment program.

As part of the check presentation, the Piedmont Technical College Foundation presented a proclamation of recognition and appreciation to Senator Shane Massey, who represents Aiken, Edgefield, McCormick and Saluda counties. The proclamation named Massey a "Distinguished Advocate for Education" in South Carolina and expressed appreciation for his outstanding leadership and dedication to education in Edgefield County and across the state.

"I think it's great for students, especially in rural areas, to have these additional educational opportunities to help prepare them for higher education and for careers in the workforce," said Massey. "I really appreciate AT&T doing this and I appreciate the partnership between Strom Thurmond and Piedmont Tech to give these students the opportunities they wouldn't have otherwise."

Currently, 42 students are participating in the traditional dual enrollment program.

Students who take six credit hours or more and who qualify for Lottery Tuition Assistance (LTA) are able to take dual enrollment classes at the high school with no tuition costs, but students are still responsible for purchasing their books.


\$900,000 FEDERAL GRANT AWARDED TO EXPAND APPRENTICESHIP IN SOUTH CAROLINA

The U.S. Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration (DOLETA) awarded the SC Technical

College System a \$900,000 grant to increase and diversify apprenticeship in the state. This grant is part of the ApprenticeshipUSA State Expansion Grant and represents the first time that the federal government will provide funding to support states in their efforts to expand and diversify registered apprenticeship to better respond to industry workforce demands.

USDOLETA's goals for the grant are threefold: 1) help states advance registered apprenticeship as a workforce development strategy and post secondary education career pathway; 2) support integrated, statewide apprenticeship strategies and meet the demand for new programs in both traditional and nontraditional industries; and 3) catalyze state innovations to significantly increase apprenticeships for all American workers, particularly low-income individuals and underrepresented populations.

The SC Technical College System's grant - SC Apprenticeship Initiative Expansion - is designed to expand youth and pre-apprenticeship opportunities, continue return on investment study to include all industries, promote STEM Premier and SC Future Makers and increase availability for dual enrollment programs.


