

LPN-to-RN Transition Nursing (ADN5) - Program Fact Sheet

Program Ready Coursework:

- BIO 210 Anatomy and Physiology I
- BIO 211 Anatomy and Physiology II
- COL 103 College Skills
 - -Prior credit for AHS 180 may be substituted for COL 103
- ENG 101 English Composition I
- MAT 120 Probability and Statistics
 - <u>or</u> MAT 110 College Algebra
- PSY 201 General Psychology
- Humanities/Fine Arts Elective

Testing Requirements:

- NLN Foundations of Nursing Exam: Minimum 65%
- Students may only take the NLN exam ONE (1) time in a 3-year period
- Scores expire after 3 years

Minimum GPA and Course Grade Requirements:

- Minimum of **3.0** in Program Ready Coursework
- A Program Ready GPA Calculator is available
- Minimum 2.0 Overall PTC GPA
- Minimum grade of C in all Program Ready and General Education Coursework
- For students awarded exemption credit for COL 103, the Program Ready GPA will be calculated without that course.

Program Location and Duration:

- Greenwood (Fall Start)
 - Program is 4-5 days a week, in person, during the day; Clinicals may be nights and weekends
- Laurens (Summer Start)
 - Program is 3-4 days a week, web hybrid format with evening labs; Clinicals may be nights, weekends or days.
- Three (3) consecutive semesters, including summers, after program admission

Program Application Process:

- Acceptance into PTC's Associate Degree Program is competitive and limited to:
 - 40 Students admitted for Fall (August) start
 - Students apply June 1-16
 - 40 Students admitted for Summer (May) start
 - Students apply February 1-16
