

# Practical Nursing (LPN1) - Program Fact Sheet

### **Program Ready Coursework:**

- BIO 112 Basic Anatomy and Physiology
  - <u>or</u> BIO 210
- COL 103 College Skills
  - Prior credit for AHS 180 may be substituted for COL 103
- ENG 101 English Composition I
- MAT 120 Probability and Statistics
  <u>or</u> MAT 110 College Algebra
- PSY 201 General Psychology

## **Other Courses Required for Graduation:**

 BIO 211 – If BIO 210 is used for Program Ready, BIO 211 must be completed prior to the end of the first semester of LPN program

### **Testing Requirements:**

- ATI TEAS Sign up at <u>www.atitesting.com</u>
- Minimum score of 65% in both Reading and Math
- Scores expire after 3 years
- See ATI TEAS Fact Sheet for more details
- Scores for TEAS taken outside of PTC may be emailed to the Testing Center at testingcenter@ptc.edu

### Minimum GPA and Course Grade Requirements:

- Minimum of **3.0** in Program Ready Coursework (Minimum of 3.0 beginning Fall 2025)
- A <u>Program Ready GPA Calculator</u> is available
- Minimum 2.0 Overall PTC GPA
- Minimum grade of C in all Program Ready and General Education Coursework
- For students awarded exemption credit for COL 103, the Program Ready GPA will be calculated without that course.

### **Program Location and Duration:**

- Greenwood Campus (Fall Start); Laurens Campus (Spring Start)
- Three (3) consecutive semesters, including summers, after program admission
- Program is 4-5 days a week, in person, during the day; Clinicals may be nights and weekends

### **Program Application Process:**

- Acceptance into PTC's Associate Degree Program is competitive and limited to:
  - 32 Students admitted for Spring (January) start - Students apply September 1-16
  - 32 Students admitted for Fall (August) start - Students apply May 1-16

Upon acceptance into the health care program, the student will complete a change of major to reflect their health care program major.

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
