

Veterinary Technology (VET3) - Program Fact Sheet

2026-2027 Change

BIO 101 will be required. BIO 102 will no longer be accepted as a program ready course.

Program Ready Coursework:

- BIO 101- Biological Science I
 - or BIO 102 Biological Science II (for Fall 2025 only)
- COL 103 College Skills

 Prior credit for AHS 180 may be substituted for COL 103
- ENG 101 English Composition I
- MAT 110 College Algebra or MAT 120 - Probability and Statistics
- PSY 201 General Psychology

Other Courses Required for Graduation:

- BIO 115 Basic Microbiology (may be taken during clinical program; only offered in Spring in Newberry)
- Humanities/Fine Arts Elective

Required Observation Hours:

- Total of 10 observation hours in at least 2 different settings are required prior to program application.
- The <u>Observation Hours Form</u> must be emailed to the program director for verification to receive credit. Send forms to Tanya Niles at <u>niles.t@ptc.edu</u>.

Minimum GPA and Course Grade Requirements:

- Minimum of **3.0** in Program Ready Coursework
- A Program Ready GPA Calculator is available
- Minimum 2.0 Overall PTC GPA
- Minimum grade of C in all Program Ready and General Education Coursework
- For students awardee exemption credit for COL 103, the Program Ready GPA will be calculated without that course.

Program Location and Duration:

- Newberry Campus
- Five (5) consecutive semesters, including summers, after program admission
- Program is up to 4-5 days a week, in person, during the day.

Program Application Process:

- Acceptance into PTC's Associate Degree Program is competitive and limited to:
 - 24 Students admitted for Fall (August) start- Students apply May 1-16
- See <u>Application Worksheet</u> for breakdown

Important Notes:

• Students who plan to pursue D.V.M. should consider a University Transfer program instead of Veterinary Technology

- Initial major for pre-health students is the Health Care Certificate. Upon acceptance into the health care program, the student will complete a change of major to reflect their health care program major.

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
