On behalf of the South Carolina Technical College System (SCTCS), I am pleased to express my full support for the articulation agreement that has been developed between the University of South Carolina-Columbia (USC) and colleges in the SCTCS that have an associate degree program with a major in Early Care and Education (ECE) and are accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).

Through this agreement, graduates from an accredited ECE program who transfer to USC have a seamless pathway into the Bachelor of Arts program in Early Childhood Education. 

Attached please find a proposed academic articulation agreement between USC Columbia and institutions in the South Carolina Technical College System that have an Associate Degree in Early Care and Education that is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). This proposal has been developed over a period of years through a series of conversations among early childhood faculty in a consortium of two- and four-year South Carolina institutions of higher education.

Early childhood education is widely recognized as addressing the care and education of children from birth through age eight. Many technical colleges have programs preparing students to work with children from birth to age five. Through the attached agreement, graduates of associate degree programs who transfer to USC Columbia can seamlessly transfer into USC's BA in Early Childhood Education and earn certification to teach in pre-kindergarten through grade three (age 8). The work of NAEYC in accrediting programs at both two- and four-year institutions is very helpful in ensuring consistency and quality across these programs.

We anticipate that this agreement will not only assist those interested in teaching young children in achieving their potential, but will also support our goal to increase the diversity of the USC student population (and the teaching population in South Carolina).

## Articulation Agreement Between Early Childhood Education College of Education University of South Carolina (USC) And

National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) Accredited Early Care and
Education Associate Degree Programs in the
South Carolina Technical College System

This agreement is a culmination of many collaborative summits, meetings, and initiatives to improve the quality of child care and early education programs in South Carolina by cultivating a well-trained and educated workforce. Collaborative partners from the Early Childhood Education community include two-year and four-year higher education institutions, Head Start, the child care community, the Center for Child Care Career Development, the SC Department of Social Services, the SC Technical College System, and other child care and early education advocates. The purpose of this agreement is to provide an opportunity for graduates who have received their Associate Degree in Early Care and Education from NAEYC accredited two-year colleges to transfer to the University of South Carolina to pursue their Bachelor Degree in Early Childhood Education.

In order to receive transfer credit, students must do the following:

- 1. Complete the approved Early Care and Education Associate Degree that includes specific courses identified by this agreement.
- 2. Earn no less than a grade of C in any course.
- 3. Meet with a USC advisor before enrolling in coursework at USC. (Recommended as soon as possible following Associate Degree completion.)
- 4. Complete additional general education courses (see below) either before or after transferring to USC. These courses may be completed at either USC or the regional technical college.
- 5. Students entering into the Early Childhood Education program at USC will be subject to the requirements specified in the catalog that is current at the time of their matriculation into the program currently including the submission of a passing score on the Praxis I or SAT or ACT examinations by December 1<sup>st</sup> of their Junior Fall.

Individual analysis of student transcripts will be made for credits accumulated under the semester system from the two-year colleges. Each institution and its authorized representatives agree to provide students who wish to transfer with relevant, current, and sound academic advice so that neither legitimate credit hours nor time will be lost in a student's attempt to secure the Associate and/or Baccalaureate degree.

The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the Commission on Higher Education guidelines, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) standards, NAEYC standards, and USC Early Childhood Education program changes. The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education, College of Education, and Early Childhood Education requirements at USC and the equivalent at the two-year college.

Typically, students taking 6 hours of introductory level foreign language prior to attending USC will have met the foreign language requirement. If this requirement is not met through transfer course work, foreign language ability can be demonstrated by achieving a score of two (2) or better on a USC foreign language placement exam. Those who do not have appropriate transfer credits or a passing placement score must satisfactorily complete equivalent study of foreign language at USC.
