Program Overview

A.A.S., MAJOR IN HUMAN SERVICES

The Human Services major is ideal for students considering a career in the helping profession. The primary purpose of the human service practitioner is to assist individuals, families, or communities to function as effectively as possible. In order to graduate, students must complete all required courses including a 270 hour field placement over two semesters — 135 hours each semester — during the last half of the program and the Human Services Board Certified Practitioner examination.

The program prepares students to work in diverse settings with diverse populations. Students will receive a foundation in theory and practice related to human services and will have the opportunity to gain hands on experience through skill and demonstration based instruction and supervised field placements. Students will practice what they have learned during a field placement under the supervision of professional employed in the field.
